The Chairman welcomed the representatives of the various societies present at the meeting and explained the proposals of the Provisional Committee, which had been circulated to all present. The following resolutions were carried by acclamation:-

- (a) The International Institute of Welding is hereby constituted.
- (b) The Constitution proposed by the Provisional Committee is approved. on the understanding that the Governing Council will later make propositions to meet the reservations expressed to-day or in the interval, by the representatives.
- (c) The first Governing Council shall consist, in accordance with the Constitution, of three delegates from each of the following countries:-

Australia (subject to Notherlands confirmation) Norway South Africa Austria Spain Belgium Denmark Sweden Switzerland France United States of America. Great Britain Italy_

- (d) The Governing Council shall meet on 11 June. It shall proceed to the statutory elections as well as to the establishment of the first international commissions, so that work may begin at once, and shall take note of the data firmished in the papers presented on 8 and 9 June.

B. RESERVATIONS

Italy

(a) The representatives of the following intimated that their adhesion as Founder Members would be subject to later confirmation by their governing bodies:-

> Australian Welding Institute, Sydney Schweisstechnische Zentralanstalt Direzione Generale Forrovie dello Stato, Centro Studio Saldatura Registro Italiano Navale Commission No.4, 'Soudure', de l'Association Suisse pour l'Essai des Matériaux.

(b) The adhesion of the Institut de Soudure and the Société des Ingénieurs Soudeurs of France was made subject to reservations alroady communicated in writing to the Secretary of the Provisional Committee and circulated to all present.

- (c) The adhesion of the Instituto Italiano della Saldatura was made subject to the same reservations as those of the two French societies.
- (d) The adhesion of the British Welding Research Association was made subject to agreement with the decisions to be reached by the Governing Council at their meeting on Friday, 11 June 1948.
- (c) The adhesion of the Société Suisse de l'Acétylène was made subject to the approval of the subscription.
- (f) The adhesion of the American Welding Society was made subject to reconsideration at the end of the first year and to approval of proposals with regard to subscriptions.
- (g) Mr.Edström, representing the Svetskommissionen, said that though they had no reservations to make, they would like to put forward a number of suggestions for the consideration of the Governing Council, as follows:-
 - (1) The draft Constitution provided that the chairmen of all commissions should be chosen from among the members of the Governing Council. Mr.Edström considered that this would unduly restrict the Council and that it was desirable that the chairmen should be chosen solely on the grounds of their special qualifications for the work of the commission concerned.
 - (2) It was further proposed in the draft Constitution that each country should be represented on each commission by one representative. He proposed that this clause should be made permissive, so that each country should have the right to representation on each commission, but should not be compelled to appoint a representative.
- (3) The Constitution provided for subscriptions by member societies. Mr.Edström proposed instead that the subscriptions should be by countries, which would avoid the difficulties arising when several member societies existed in one country, which would not necessarily be wealthier than countries having only one society.
